Instructor Development Course

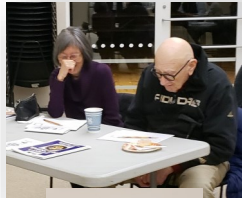

Bonus Info: The month with the least snow fall is **July** with an average total accumulation of 0.0 inches. Now that's good news!

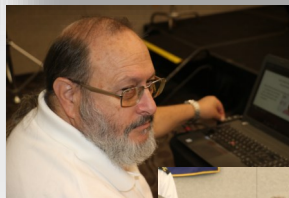

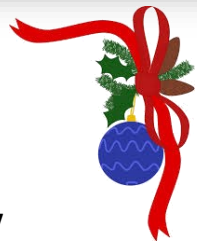

Safety Article

“Planning for Spring”

With winter in full swing, my thoughts (like yours) turn towards Spring days when we will find ourselves on the water when the wind is not quite so blistery. While planning for this year's '*Spring Boating*,' consider the many opportunities you can share to help yourself and others become safer boaters.

As you know, Oyster Bay created an *On-the-Water Activity Award* as one aspect to celebrate our 50th Anniversary. Still, on a more important note, this award was developed to encourage other squadrons (and their SEOs) to establish practical on-the-water activities for their students, members, and the public. It encourages SEOs to take the theoretical information from their classes/seminars and help individuals practice the applications taught on the water in real-life situations. Of course, winter classes may not be ideal to include on-the-water activities, but let's think **Spring!**

Consequently, now is the perfect time to start planning these activities that will help hone critical boating skills. Or perhaps you would consider volunteering to share your boating knowledge, and you would be helping others have a safer time on the water this Spring and Summer.

USPS/America's Boating Club has several programs that fit with Oyster Bay's *On-the-Water Award* standards:

- **Jump Start**—The unique framework supports squadrons conducting one-on-one training sessions for a member or non-member in their boats. This program is tailored to each boat operator and their boat. The squadron mentor(s) will help the boat operation practice basic docking, how to use safety equipment, discuss pre-cruising checklists, and basic engine pre-departure activities. This program was created to reinforce skills and help boaters become more confident. And it is FREE.
- **On-the-WATER Teaching Aid Guides** – These guides are available for all advanced boating courses, including related boat handling and navigational aspects. They focus on teaching the students how to take the basic knowledge presented in the classroom environment and transfer that desired skill to an on-the-water experience. Each guide is geared towards the course/seminar and meets the American National Standard Institute requirements for recreational power boating and the skills set taught.
- **Hands-On–Training: Basic Powerboat**—This program was designed for NEW boaters, providing them with essential skill-based techniques needed while operating a power boat. This program was developed under a US Coast Guard grant and also coordinates with the national on-water standard policies. This 8-hour training session includes 3 hours of classroom and 5 hours of on-the-water practical training experience at the helm. Students learn about safety equipment and proper procedures, boat control, maneuvering, and much more.



We all need refreshers from time to time. Even the best Chefs revert back to their tried and true recipes. So even if you are a seasoned boater, a day on the water (with new boaters) could help you, also, review some basic skills. Plus you'll have fun as you get into shape for the wonderful boating season ahead this summer.

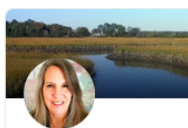

The boatyard in winter

I encourage you to visit your boat and enjoy the beautiful experience of a boatyard in winter. My boat, *The Melodic*, stays in the water all winter on the Branford River, and I spend many hours onboard to assure it (and myself) that warmer sailing days are ahead.

However, the ice and cold can be particularly dangerous near the water, so here are a few things to remember:

- **Watch out for slick conditions.** Negotiating an icy ladder to get aboard a boat on the stands can be tricky. If you're not sure it's safe, spend your time examining your boat's bottom and below-water gear instead.
- **Be prepared in case of emergency.** You'll most likely be the only one in the boatyard in winter. If something goes wrong, yelling for help won't cut it. So make sure you have your cell-phone with you, and let someone know where you are and when you expect to return.
- **Take cold weather precautions.** If you venture out onto the docks, you must wear a life jacket. Falling into the drink is never fun, but in winter, hypothermia can make it fatal. There's a small cove on the East River that, given a peculiar combination of eddies and currents, always traps the winter flotsam from western Long Island Sound and the Harlem, Hudson and East rivers. Every year authorities recover more than a few bodies, boaters who slipped off their docks or fell off boats into the frigid waters.
- **Exercise caution when using a heater onboard.** Taking an afternoon snooze aboard a floating boat in winter is one of life's great joys, but using a space heater onboard can be dangerous. If you have a radiant heater that works like a toaster with bright orange filament strips, or if your heater stays on when tipped over, donate these lethal heaters to the nearest dump. Instead, buy a small, inexpensive ceramic or oil-filled radiator to use onboard. Since fire is always a possibility, keep your fire extinguisher at hand. Find out if your marina bans heaters of any kind. Your insurance won't cover any damage if that's the case.
